SECOND DAY: Read I Peter 3:1,2

1.		Christian wife has an incredible opportunity to influence the life of her husband. Consider s as you read I Peter 3:1,2. What do you learn about this from these verses?
	a.	Notice the word <i>Likewise</i> in verse 1a. What do you think this word refers to?
	b.	Observe I Peter 3:1,2 NIV: Wives, in the same way be submissive to your husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the Word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives. Why is this kind of behavior from a wife so powerful?
2.		od has designed an order for the marriage relationship. Use Ephesians 5:22-24 to explain the Peter 3:1a instruction: wives, be in subjection to your own husbands.
	a.	Record what I Corinthians 11:3 reveals about God's order.
	b.	This does not mean women are inferior to men. Neither does it mean that single women are inferior to those who are married. How do the following verses confirm this: (1.) Galatians 3:28
		(2.) I Corinthians 7:32-34
	c.	Read Genesis 2:18. What does this say to you about the role of a wife?

THIRD DAY: Read I Peter 3:3,4

1.	The instructions of I Peter 3:3,4 are directed to wives but are applicable for all women. We will take two days of our lesson to concentrate on these valuable verses. Here Peter contrasts <i>external</i> and <i>internal</i> adornment. Write what verses 3,4a say about our <i>adorning</i> :

	b. What is the opposite of a meek and quiet spirit?
	c. Recall from I Peter 2:22,23 Jesus' example of <i>a meek and quiet spirit</i> . How does having <i>a meek and quiet spirit</i> affect our reactions and relationships?
2.	A <i>meek and quiet spirit</i> does not mean a Christian woman should not be productive and active. How does the virtuous woman of Proverbs 31:10-31 exemplify this?
	a. What especially speaks to you from her example?
3.	Take a moment to think about the value the Lord places on the I Peter 3:4 attitudes and behavior as you consider the following: <i>which is very precious in the sight of God.</i> verse 4c NKJV How should this motivate us to follow the instructions of I Peter 3:3,4?
	a. What does it require of us to develop that which is <i>very precious</i> in the sight of God?

FIFTH DAY: Read I Peter 3:5-7

1.	We will benefit from the examples given to us in I Peter 3:5,6. Identify these from the following:
	a. verse 5a
	b. verse 6a
2.	Describe the <i>holy women</i> from I Peter 3:5b.
	a. Focus on the phrase: who trusted in God. Why is this essential?
3.	I Peter 3:6 tells us Sara called Abraham <i>lord</i> which revealed her honor and respect for her husband. How is she an example for a Christian wife?
Ad	Ivanced students: Research the meaning of the phrase: and are not afraid with any amazement. I Peter 3:6c Record your findings.
4.	Read I Peter 3:7. Although the instruction in this verse is directed to <i>husbands</i> , it contains insights about women. The phrase <i>weaker vessel</i> refers to a woman's weaker <i>physical strength</i> . Think about the following description of a Christian husband and wife: <i>being heirs together of the grace of life</i> . How does this minister to you?
	a. Notice the serious implications of the last phrase of verse 7. How is prayer affected by conflict between marriage partners?
