THIRD DAY: Read II Corinthians 6:3-10

1.	Through II Corinthians 6:3-10 Christians are given an excellent example of commitment and conduct for ministry. Consider verses 3,4a NLT: We try to live in such a way that no one will be hindered from finding the Lord by the way we act, and so no one can find fault with our ministry. In every thing we do we try to show that we are true ministers of God. Paul's statement of integrity as a minister of Christ should be ours too. What things could interfere with our living this way?
	a. Share one or two resources you have for dealing with these interferences.
