SECOND DAY: Read Daniel 11:36-39

1.	Although the prophecies in this week's lesson were written hundreds of years ago, they reveal dramatic events that will take place during the final seven-year period of history. Then Jesus will set up His one thousand year reign on the earth. Begin your study today by reading about <i>the king</i> (the final dictator) in Daniel 11:36-39. TH	IIRD DAY: Read Daniel 11:40-45

2.	In Daniel 11:41 the glorious land refers to Israel and Ammon is Jordan and Iraq. Pastor Chuck says: Jordan will not be taken by the Antichrist, though Israel will. Interesting, because the Jews will actually flee for protection to Jordan to the rock city of Petra, where they will be preserved by God for three and half years, during the time of the great indignation or the wrath of God which is to be poured out upon the earth. What does this reveal to you about our God?
3.	Regarding Daniel 11:44 Pastor Chuck says: The Antichrist's European federation of nations begins to move against Africa, passing through Israel and taking Egypt. The Chinese will send their armies, along with the remnant of the Russian army, to battle his forces. These armies will meet in the Valley of Megiddo for the great and final battle of Armageddon. The Antichrist will meet his end there. Share your response to this.
