FIRST DAY:	Review and Overview	

- 1. Share a thought or blessing you received from your study of Ephesians 2:11–22.
- 2. God in His grace has a specific call for each of our lives. This call has to do with the unique gifting and grace He has given to each one of us. Paul knew the specific calling on his life and was enthusiastic about it. In Ephesians 3:1–13, Paul detailed the call he received by revelation from God.
 - The revelation God gave to Paul was that salvation was also for the Gentiles.
 - The call God gave to Paul was to take the Gospel to the Gentiles.

Capture Paul's enthusiasm by citing key phrases from the following verses that speak about God's revelation and call:

- b. Ephesians 3:5–7
- c. Ephesians 3:8-9
- d. Ephesians 3:10-13

SECOND DAY: Read Ephesians 3:1-4

FOURTH DAY: Read Ephesians 3:8-9

- 2. What was Paul given? Ephesians 3:8b
 - a. What was Paul to preach among the Gentiles? Ephesians 3:8c
 - (1) Link this with Colossians 2:3 and share your thoughts.
- 3. The *fellowship of the mystery* emphasizes the fact that Jew and Gentile share in the blessings of a relationship with God through Christ. Why do you think Paul longed to *make all see* this? Ephesians 3:9
 - a. What did Paul state about this plan that was from the beginning of the ages? Ephesians 3:9b
 - b. What did Paul say about God? Ephesians 3:9c
- 4. Consider the glory and humility associated with such a ministry by reading Ephesians 3:8 in the NLT, Though I am the least deserving of all God's people, He graciously gave me the privilege of telling the Gentiles about the endless treasures available to them in Christ:
 - a. How do you see the affect of this ministry on Paul's self-assessment?
 - b. Why do you think God's grace and power were necessary for Paul's ministry?
 - c. Briefly share a way you have experienced:
 - (1) God's *grace* in your life or ministry
 - (2) God's power

FIFTH DAY: Read Ephesians 3:10-13

- 1. Use Ephesians 3:10 to answer the following questions:
 - a. What was God's intent in revealing these things? Ephesians 3:10a
 - (1) The word manifold means variegated or many-sided. What does this suggest about God's intent?
 - (2) Link this with Romans 11:33. What do you see?
 - b. By whom might this be made known? Ephesians 3:10b
 - (1) Who would this include?
 - c. *To* whom was it to *be made known*? Ephesians 3:10c
 - (1) Link this with Philippians 2:10–11. Share your thoughts.
- 2. From Ephesians 3:11 describe God's *purpose*.
- 3. Comment on the blessings that are ours through faith in Christ. Ephesians 3:12
 - a. How should this affect your approach to prayer? See also Hebrews 4:16.
 - (1) Share something you would like to pray for with greater *boldness* and *confidence*.
- 4. In light of Paul's God-given ministry, what did he ask the Ephesians? Ephesians 3:13a
 - a. Read Acts 20:37–38 to recall the relationship Paul had with the Ephesians. Why do you think they needed to be encouraged not to *lose heart*?
 - b. In Ephesians 3:13b what did Paul remind them about his tribulations?
 - (1) How does Philippians 1:12 amplify Paul's perspective on his tribulations?
 - (2) How is Paul's perspective an example to you?
