5.	What did Cornelius do after the angel <i>had departed</i> ? Acts 10:7-8				
	a. What does his response to the angel's words indicate about him?				
6.	How does today's study minister to you about God reaching out to mankind? See John 4:23b.

2	In Acts 10:28a Peter made it clear that it was <i>unlawful</i> for him as a Jew to associate with Gentiles. However, what had God <i>shown</i> Peter? Acts 10:28b
	a. Recall the way in which God had <i>shown</i> this to Peter. Acts 10:9–16
3	Because of what God revealed to him, Peter <i>came without objection</i> to Cornelius (Acts 10:29). Cornelius then explained why he asked Peter to <i>come</i> . What do you find remarkable about his testimony? Acts 10:30–33
4	From Acts 10:34–35 choose key points from Peter's response that show God's heart toward mankind.
	a. Link this with Colossians 3:11 and 2 Peter 3:9. What do you see?
5	Answer the following from Peter's message in Acts 10:36–43:

	c. Comment on Peter's description of Jesus. Acts 10:38
	d. Of what were the disciples <i>witnesses</i> ? Acts 10:39–41

	e. What were the disciples <i>commanded</i> to <i>testify</i> ? Acts 10:42
